## **Border Prosecution Unit Quick Facts**

- Initial funding in 81<sup>st</sup> Legislature (SB 1, Art. IX, Sec. 17.04(4)), in the amount of \$4,000,000 for the biennium for "prosecution resources" in aid of Border Security Operations. Administered as trusteed grant program through Criminal Justice Division of Governor's Office.
- Covers sixteen (16) prosecution offices from El Paso to Brownsville, encompassing 39 counties.
- Grant allows each DAs office to hire assistant prosecutor and/or investigator whose primary responsibility is to better handle and coordinate prosecution of border crimes.
- Actitivies coordinated through the Border Prosecution Unit Board of Directors, headed by chairman Rene Pena, District Attorney for the 81<sup>st</sup> Judicial District (Floresville) and vicechairman Isidro Alaniz, District Attorney for the 49<sup>th</sup> Judicial District (Laredo.)
- Grant goes to the office of 34<sup>th</sup> Judicial District Attorney Jaime Esparza and administered by contract with the other fifteen (15) participating jurisdictions. Initial grant awarded in February, 2010 in amount of approximately \$1.75 million; year 2 budget of approximately \$2.25 million.
- Established definition of "border crime" and created performance measures.
- Working closely with Department of Public Safety to develop first-of-its-kind protocol on handling border cases. Also participating in joint training exercises with DPS and other state, local and federal law enforcement agencies.

- Particular focus on violent crime (murder, kidnapping, extortion), criminal enterprises associated with cartels and drug trade, financial crimes and human trafficking.
- Taking the lead in developing better communications with local law enforcement organizations and improving coordination between jurisdictions in handling of cases that reach across county/jurisdictional boundaries.
