## Sen. Kelly Hancock Announces District 9 Mobile Office Hours – Nov. 2018

Senate staff available to assist area residents with state agency issues in Arlington, Watauga

**North Richland Hills, TX** - Today, Texas State Senator Kelly Hancock announced the November 2018 Mobile Office Hours schedule for Senate District 9. The program is geared toward local residents who need assistance resolving an issue with a state government agency.

"The number one goal of our district team is to help District 9 constituents cut through red tape when they have a problem with a state agency," said Hancock. "While staff is available to help at any time from our North Richland Hills office, the Mobile Office Hours program brings that service directly into each community throughout the year."

Examples of state agency casework include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Child support collection (Office of the Texas Attorney General)
- Handgun licensing (Texas Department of Public Safety)
- Insurance or utility complaints (Texas Department of Insurance / Public Utility Commission)
- State employee retirement benefits (Employee / Teacher Retirement Systems)
